#### To the Point

Luke's November 10 message on lay-led churches got me to thinking. Any religious organization that loses its leader, its minister, is bound to go through trying emotional times. Questions abound. What will happen to us? Have we lost our identity, our authenticity? Will we survive? Of course, our little church is not the only one to have gone through this. As Luke said, the earliest Christian congregations of the first century as well as many UU congregations of the mid-twentieth century — and today — are facing the same thing. But we're lucky to have a record of the first time a congregation was faced with the imminent loss of a beloved leader. And we're lucky also to have the words of that leader to his congregants 2,500 years ago.

On his death bed, Siddhartha Gautama, the Buddha, told his despairing followers not to worry that he would be gone. For, he said, they would always be in possession of the Three Jewels: the Dhamma, the Sangha and the Buddha. The teachings of the Eight-fold Path and the Four Truths constituted the Dhamma. The spiritual companionship shared as the disciples joined together (the Sangha) to learn and practice the teachings. And the central spiritual experience (the Buddha) that occurred for each individual as he shared in the glow of enlightenment produced from his own search interwoven with that of his fellows.

Thought about in this way, the Universalist Unitarian Church of Waterville has itself been left with the Three Jewels. As Dhamma, we have the teachings of our Principles, distilled from the greatest religious teachers in history. We have each other when we come together to worship — our Sangha. And, together, we feel the warmth of our own Buddha-natures glowing in our hearts like the flame of our chalice.

We should trust the Buddha's words. *Dennis Perkins* Board President

#### **Worship Committee**

The results are in from the Worship Service Survey! We are delighted to announce the overall results. We received 41 responses, which represents 2/3 of the church membership.

The first question that we asked the congregation was "To what extent have the worship services met your spiritual needs?" Seventeen people said that their spiritual needs were being met *very much*; 17 people said that their spiritual needs were being met *somewhat*, and 7 people said that their spiritual needs were being met only *a little bit*. No one said that their spiritual needs were *not being met at all*.

When we asked what people liked most about our worship services, the most common responses related to:

- 1. learning about new ideas and perspectives,
- 2. the fellowship and community of our worship services,
- 3. the variety of topics, ministers and speakers; and,
- 4. the music.

The most common suggestions for how we could improve our worship services related to:

- 1. practical ideas for helping the services run more smoothly,
- 2. having an ordained minister who was either full-time or part-time, or who was simply a regular monthly speaker at our church; and,
- 3. connecting the worship services to the UU Principles.

The Worship Committee is grateful to everyone who participated in the Worship Service Survey, and we are working hard to incorporate the congregation's feedback into our services as much as possible.

As always, please feel free to invite friends or family to our worship services. We believe that the UU message is especially important in today's world and that it will resonate with many people, even those who have never attended a UU worship service.

#### What is a Facebook "Event"?

The website Whatis provides the following description of a Facebook Event:

A Facebook event is a calendar-based resource which can be used to notify users of upcoming occasions. Events can be created by anyone, and can be open to anyone or kept private. The creator can invite his friends, members of a group, or fans of a page.

Facebook events are a great way to spread the word on upcoming event or occasions, since they can reach thousands of people in a short amount of time. The event can also provide an "RSVP" list, which displays lists of invitees grouped by their response. Invitees are either placed in "attending," "not attending," "may be attending" or "hasn't responded" lists. If an invitee RSVPs that they are "attending" the event, it appears in their news feed to notify their friends. When the date of the event approaches, it is displayed on the invitees' home pages to remind them. Source: https://whatis.techtarget.com/definition/Facebook-event
