To the Point

We made it! The darkest day (December 21) of 2020 is behind us. We shared the first tiny lights of the new year from our Zoom windows at the Christmas Eve service and it worked—just like our ancient worshipping relatives promised. The small fires of the solstice (ritualized in the Christian Advent candles, Jewish Hanukkah menorah and the Druidic bonfires, among others) began their work of drawing more light (love, forgiveness, hope, resolve) into the world almost immediately.

At first, however, the change is barely noticeable. Only a few seconds per day of additional light for the first couple of weeks until it increases to minutes per day by the equinox. Perhaps this is the lesson to remember in all challenges in our human experience: in the darkest moments when all seems lost, if we can keep the small flames of our faith: faith in ourselves, in our fellows, in our principles burning, then their light will bring a wider, deeper, warmer glow to our world.

We have been through a lot together during this pandemic. It has been difficult for each of us, but the demands of isolating for our common safety have been especially burdensome for the very elderly and for young families with small children. I think, especially this

I know you've all been waiting with bated breath for this year's stewardship drive to be announced (Ha Ha!). Again this year, Stewardship for the 2021/22 fiscal year will begin at the end of January and run through the month of February, beginning with the Stewardship service on January 31.

This year's theme will be *Stewards of Patience*. Materials will arrive the first week of February. To paraphrase the Postman's Promise: "Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night (nor COVID) will stay the Stewardship Committee from its rounds!"

Interfaith Council

The Interfaith Council met by Zoom on Wednesday, December 9, 2020. The agenda covered two main points of discussion: Community Issues and Congressional Issues.

The Interfaith Resource Fund is low on funds. This is especially concerning as many requests are coming in for help with heat as the cold weather is here. (See note below.). A big reason for a lack of funds at this critical time is that United Way was not able to provide IRF with its usual considerable sum of money designated for heating relief.

The Essentials Closet at the UCC location at The Elm, while fully stocked, was not open in November due to lack of volunteers due to COVID-19. Many folks in our community depend on this service for essentials such as toilet paper, toothpaste, and toothbrushes as well as soap, laundry detergent, and personal supplies. The Homeless Shelter noted that it is available 24 hours a day if essentials are needed in an emergency situation. KVCAP has a Hope Fund specifically for laundry needs.

The Waterville Area Soup Kitchen has been up and running for several weeks. The bulk of the cooking is done in the kitchen at St. Mark's Church and served out of two food trucks in the noon hour on Monday and Thursdays. The four locations are Head of Falls, Veterans Park, Green Street, and a small park near the elementary school. This group would like to add Saturday and another site to its future plans. They are looking for a third cook to help enable this to occur. Council members suggested looking to Colby and Thomas students as well as AmeriCorps as volunteers.

The Waterville Homeless Shelter is proud to announce it has the strongest and best follow-up record of all the shelters in the state! This statistic deals with the support and continuing services given to folks that have left the shelter and are no longer homeless. Congratulations!

On another note, all Town Halls have a 24-hour Hot Line for emergency intake for shelter. This can be accessed through calling 211 and asking for the 24-Hour INTAKE number.

Congregational issues concerned how to provide meaningful Christmas Eve Services in the time of COVID-19.

NOTE: The UU Church Board graciously invited me to speak about the Interfaith Resource Fund and our contributions. Our church has a dedicated line item in our budget which has been increased from last year's budget. I explained the increasing need at this time of year to fund heating requests and make up the devastating loss of United Way funds for this purpose. I am so grateful to report that your generous Church Board voted to give the IRF an additional sum this year and to consider doing so again each October. Contributions to the IRF are spent entirely on assistance to others; there are no administrative costs. Many heartfelt thank yous.
